



 Left click the Network Connections icon in the system tray, and click on Open Network and Sharing Center




2. Click the Manage wireless networks link in the sidebar.




3. Click Add in the menu bar. On the manually connect screen select Manually create a network profile.






5. When the network has been successfully added click the Change connection settings option.



6. On the eduroam Wireless Network Properties screen, click the Security tab and then click the Settings button.




7. In the Protected EAP properties panel make sure **Validate server certificate** is **unchecked**, and click the **Configure**... button:




8. **Uncheck** 'Automatically use my Windows logon name' and click the OK button.




9. Click the **OK** button.




10. Click on the Advanced Settings button.




11. Tick **Specify authentication mode**, select **User authentication** from the drop-down menu and click the **Save credentials** button.
